#### Violets Visit Southfork

The Dallas Metro African Violet Societies (Alpha AVS, First AVS of Dallas and First Nighter AVS) are thrilled to host the 2014 LSAVC convention and show on October 30 through November 1 at the Southfork Hotel in Plano. The hotel is a sister property to Southfork Ranch and is conveniently located off Central Expressway just north of President George Bush Tollway and five minutes from downtown Plano. An abundance of local restaurants are in downtown Plano for your dining pleasure. Shopping is easily accessible at Collin Creek Mall, Watters Creek, Allen Outlet Mall, the Village at Allen and the Village at Fairview. If antiques are your pleasure, there are many antique shops in downtown Plano as well as an Antique Mall off Central Expressway. Based upon availability, hotel registrants have a complimentary shuttle to take them anywhere within a five mile radius of the hotel. The hotel rates are only \$79 per night and include two tickets per room for a complimentary full breakfast in the hotel restaurant as well as a two for the price of one coupon to tour Southfork Ranch. The showroom and sales room are very spacious. The workshops, showroom, sales room and banquet room will be located in the same hallway. Our vendors will have lots of gorgeous plants to purchase in the Commercial Sales Room. When you arrive at the hotel, your show plants can be conveniently unloaded under the portico on the north side of the building. Entries and Classification will be right across the hall from the portico.

A distinguished group of speakers will be presenting workshops. Dr. Bill Price will do an "other Gesneriad" walk through the showroom immediately following the judging of the show on Friday. Bill is an internationally known Gesneriad show winner and judge. He will talk about the show exhibits, what was grown well and why, and what growers could do to improve their exhibits. Following the Saturday business meeting, a workshop will be presented by Ben Haning which will feature growing Texas size African violet trailers and general violet culture. Ben was awarded the Best Trailer and Horticulture Sweepstakes at both the 2013 and 2014 AVSA Convention Shows as well as the Best in Show in Austin with his trailer, Rob's Galiwinku. Patty Daniel will present a workshop about how she grows streptocarpus immediately following Ben's presentation. Patty owns Patty's Plants & Antiques in Winfield, Kansas where she grows streptocarpus, African violets and begonias. All of our presenters will have cuttings to share with those who attend their presentations. Be sure to register at the Convention so you may attend these informative workshops. What a bargain!

Polish up those plants for the horticulture division of the show. Check out the design classes in the show schedule which feature themes from the television series, *Dallas*. The fantastic exhibits found at Lone Star are part of the reason people attend the show and convention from all over the great state of Texas and beyond. ## Other Gesneriad Showroom Walk Through by Bill Price

Bill's interest in African violets began when he was about 12 years old and took over the care of his family's house plants. He hails from Vancouver, Canada and has exhibited violets and other Gesneriads in both Canadian and American National Shows. He has won top honors at both shows repeatedly and is highly sought after as a speaker and a judge. Bill won Best in Show at the 2009 AVSA Convention with one of his many spectacular trailers. The highlight of the 2010 Gesneriad Society Show in Vancouver was a trip to Bill Price's home overlooking the shores of the Pacific. His three story home was filled with incredible horticultural specimens and exotic plants. He has earned degrees as both a Medical Doctor and a Psychiatrist. Bill will share his expertise in a walk through of the "other Gesneriad" classes in the showroom. Afterwards, he will have cuttings to share with those in attendance.

## Growing Texas Size Trailers and Violet Culture by Ben Haning

Ben received his first violet from his wife, Nancy, on their one month anniversary in March of 1987. He built a homemade stand and grew violets for a few vears. Then after taking a reprieve from growing violets, he joined the First Nighter AVS of Dallas and started showing his African violets. Ben was awarded the Best in Show and Best Trailer at the AVSA Convention in 2013 in Austin with his trailer, Rob's Galiwinku. This year at the Nashville AVSA Convention, he won the award for the Best AVSA Mini/Semimini Collection with Rob's Boolaroo, Rob's Vanilla Trail, and Milky Way Trail. In addition, Rob's Boolaroo was awarded the 3<sup>rd</sup> Best African Violet in the Show and Best Trailer. In both 2013 and 2014, Ben won the Horticulture Sweepstakes award at the AVSA Convention. Ben is a veterinarian and enjoys nurturing animals as well as plants. Violets are grown in his home as well as in his veterinary clinic office. He will discuss growing trailers and some of his ideas about violet culture in general. Cuttings and leaves will be given to those who attend the workshop.

## **Streptocarpus** by Patty Daniel

Patty owned and operated Patty's Plant Place outside Cheney, Kansas from about 1976 to 1989. When she first started with African violets and their relatives, she ordered seed from Park's catalog and grew some Weisman hybrid streptocarpus. There were a number of colors of lobes and throats, and she loved them all. At that time, she was unable to sell a streptocarpus, so she stuck to African violets until she decided to go back to college in 1989. After obtaining a BS and an MS in geology and teaching a few years, she decided to start growing plants again. Imagine her delight when she discovered the number of people who were growing and/or hybridizing streps. Patty now owns Patty's Plants & Antiques in Winfield, Kansas and her plant sales room is filled with blooming streptocarpus. In her basement, she grows streps, violets, and begonias. Now she sells as many streptocarpus as African violets. Patty will have cuttings to share with those who attend her workshop to learn her method of growing breath taking streptocarpus.

No visit to Dallas is complete without a visit to the the legendary Southfork Ranch. For thirteen years, television sets were tuned to 356 episodes of "Dallas". Today Southfork continues to welcome visitors from around the world with guided tours. There is now a 63,000 square foot Conference and Event center that is used for all types of special events.

**SECTION XV INTERPRETIVE PLANT ARRANGEMENTS:** Designs using one or more blooming African violet plants. Fresh-cut, dried, treated or colored plant material plus man-made material (other than artificial plant material) may be used. Accessories, backdrops and draping are optional. Exception Class 75 is to feature a non-blooming African Violet.

- Class 74. **"WHO SHOT J. R.?"** Your interpretation of this mystery. To be staged in a white niche 18" high, 14" wide and 7" deep (depth can extend to 10") Limit 5
- Class 75. "RODEO TIME AT SOUTHFORK" Regular rodeos were always presented as entertainment for visitors and guests. A plant arrangement using a non-blooming African violet. To be staged in a white niche 20" high, 16" wide and 8" deep (depth can extend to 12") Limit 5
- Class 76. "CHUCK WAGON DINNER" This is one of the most requested tours offered at Southfork. Arrangement to be staged in a white niche 10" high, 10" wide and 5"deep (depth can extend to 8") Limit 5

**SECTION XVI INTERPRETIVE FLOWER ARRANGEMENTS:** Designs using fresh-cut African violet blossoms, foliage and other plant material. Dried, treated or colored plant material plus man-made material (other than artificial plant material) may be used. Accessories, backdrops and draping are optional.

- Class 77. "THE CATTLEMEN'S GALA" Everyone wanted to be on the guest list for this event. A flower arrangement to be staged in a white niche 18" high, 14" wide and 7" deep (depth can extend to 10") Limit 5
- Class 78. "ALL THOSE LIES" Create your design in black and/or white, with a touch of color using any color blossom. Backdrop or drapery, if used should also be black or white. To be staged in a white niche 10" tall, 8" wide and 4"deep (depth can extent to 8"). Limit 5
- Class 79. "TWO-TIMING" That scoundrel J. R. is off in his famous Lincoln again tonight. An open table arrangement to be staged on a 12" black foam board square. Height not to exceed 18" and to be viewed from the front only. Limit 5
  - Class 80. "LUCY'S WEDDING" An arrangement depicting the "rich and famous" at an event of this scope. To be staged on an open table on black pedestals 5" high with an 8"square top. No backdrops permitted and to be viewed from the front only. Design to be no more than 9" high. Limit 5
  - Class 81. "J. R.'s HAT" You never saw J. R. without his hat. A hanging flower arrangement to be staged in a 10" high X 8" wide black frame which will be furnished. Design is to hang from an eye screw from center of frame. To be viewed from the front only. Limit 5
  - Class 82. "FILL IT UP AGAIN" Drinks flowed like water on all occasions. A mirror image arrangement. Displayed 5" in front and 5" behind a 10" high X 8" wide black picture frame which will be furnished. Limit 5
  - Class 83. "POOL PARTY" Imagine what can be found at the bottom of the pool after a wild pool party. Create your design in a clear glass container with design completely covered with water. Container not to exceed 12" in any direction. To be staged at eye level. See Rule 41. Limit 6

#### SECTION XVII. CONTAINER GARDENS:

The classes for the container gardens are untitled so as not to discourage the entering of established gardens. Use your imagination as to what can be seen or done on many of the current outdoor tours or the events of the "Old Working Ranch" while working the cattle or having fun at the rodeos.

- Class 84. **TERRARIUM** A miniature garden in a covered transparent container. No mirrored terrariums are permitted. To be viewed from the front only. Container not to exceed 24". Limit 5 **DISH GARDEN** Planted in a shallow container. To be viewed from the front only.
- Class 85. LARGE DISH GARDEN—Container not to exceed 24". Limit 5
- Class 86. **SMALL DISH GARDEN** Container not to exceed 12". Limit 5 **NATURAL GARDEN** –To be viewed from the front only
- Class 87. A miniature garden in natural materials such as driftwood or rock. Container not to exceed 24". Limit 5

#### GENERAL RULES OF THE SHOW ENTRIES

1. All horticulture and design entries must be received between 2:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. on Thursday, October 30, 2014. Workers' plants should be entered between 10:00 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. on Thursday, October 30. Any entry arriving late will be marked "For Exhibition Only" and will not be judged.

- 2. Design entries may be completed between 7:00 a.m. and 7:45 a.m. on Friday, October 31. Design entries must be approved by the Design Classification Chairman no later than 8:00 a.m. October 31, 2014.
- 3. Entries will be accepted only from members of LSAVC who are registered with this convention.
- 4. An entry form will be provided to each exhibitor on which to list their entries for horticulture. This form will be sent to the exhibitor upon receipt of registration for the LSAVC Convention. Bring this completed form to Entries and Classification when entering your plants. Your entry cards will be printed using the First Class Entries program.
- 5. An exhibit may not be altered or removed (except to replace blooms in a design) until the show is closed. Design blossoms may be replaced between 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. on Saturday November 1, 2014.
- 6. Only clean, healthy plants will be accepted and all horticulture entries must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least 90 days prior to the show.
- 7. All African Violet exhibits must be in bloom. Gesneriads, other than African Violets, may be entered for Ornamental Foliage only in classes 65, 66, 67, 68, 70, and 73.
- 8. No double potting, flared-top pots, supports or collars under foliage will be permitted. All pots must be slip potted into clean neutral colored pots of the same size. The inner pot must be covered with plastic or foil to prevent leaks onto the table. Inner pots may be of any color and may extend above the rim of the outside pot. Exceptions to slip potting are white self-contained reservoirs, such as Oyama or Moist-Rite, unusual containers, hanging baskets and other Gesneriads.
- 9. Exhibits may be sold after the show opens, but may not be removed until Saturday, November 1, 2014 at 4:00 p.m. LSAVC members may start removing their exhibits at 4:00 p.m.
- 10. All exhibits must be removed from the show room within two hours of the end of the awards banquet on Saturday, November 1, 2014.

#### **CLASSIFICATION**

- 11. Each variety must be correctly named or be subject to correction by the Classification Committee.
- 12. All entries will be classified according to the latest First Class, AVSA Master Variety List, Supplements or Hybridizer's lists. A cultivar does not have to be listed to be entered in the show.
- 13. Violets with two-tone blossoms are to be entered in the regular color classes of that color (example: two-tone pink goes in the pink class).
- 14. Streptocarpus specimens will be entered in appropriate color classes (61, 62, 63, and 64) by predominate color.

#### **JUDGING**

- 15. The show will be judged by the merit system. Only qualified AVSA Judges will be permitted to judge, using the AVSA scale of points applicable to each class. Decisions of judges are final, unless in conflict with the show schedule or AVSA rules. Judges and clerks will assemble at 8:30 a.m. on Friday, October 31, 2014 for instructions. The judging will follow immediately and will continue until finished.
- 16. The only persons allowed in the show area during judging will be the Judges, Show Chairman, Judges Chairman, Clerks, Awards Chairman and Classification Chairman or their representatives.
- 17. Ribbons and special awards will be given according to the scale of points in the latest AVSA Judges Handbook.
- 18. Only blue ribbon exhibits will be eligible to receive AVSA or other special awards.
- 19. Awards of merit may be given by the judges upon request.

#### HORTICULTURE DIVISION

- 20. An exhibitor may enter only one plant of a variety in any one class.
- 21. All African Violets must be single crown varieties with the exception of trailers, or species.
- 22. Any number of seedlings may be entered, provided they have been originated by the exhibitor, or the exhibitor must have permission or release of rights in writing from the hybridizer. Entries must not have been previously shown in an LSAVC show
- 23. Only persons who have not previously received a blue ribbon in horticulture in an AVSA judged show may enter Class 48, Novice.
- 24. Exhibits or entries in the African Violet in Unusual Container Section (Classes 55 and 56) must be of show quality. The container is to reflect the theme of the show; only one (1) entry per class for each exhibitor.
- 25. Gesneriads other than African Violets (Section XIV) may be exhibited in an open or closed environment and will be table displayed. If riser is needed in any exhibit, it must be furnished by the exhibitor.

- 26. Vintage specimens (Class 53) can be any African Violet that has been hybridized over 25 years ago. MVL or dated hybridizers list must be furnished by the exhibitor to verify the variety's age.
- 27. LSAVC will afford all possible protection to exhibits, but will not be responsible for any damages or losses.

#### **COLLECTIONS**

- 28. AVSA Collections Class 1 and 6 must be a collection of three (3) different AVSA registered standard varieties of the same type, three (3) single crown or three (3) trailers of the same type. Classes 2 and 7 must be a collection of three (3) different AVSA registered, semiminiatures or miniatures of the same type, three (3) single crown or three (3) trailers of the same type. Classes 3 and 8 must be a collection of three (3) different species of any type.
  - Only AVSA amateur members in good standing are eligible to enter Classes 1, 2 and 3 and only AVSA commercial members in good standing are eligible to enter Classes 6, 7 and 8. Be prepared to present a current AVSA membership card. Registration number or ID for species of each specimen must appear beside the name of the cultivar on the entry form.
- 29. LSAVC Collections Class 4 and 9 must be a collection of three (3) different Texas hybridized standard varieties of the same type, three (3) single crown or three (3) trailers. Classes 5 and 10 must be a collection of three (3) different Texas hybridized semiminiatures or miniatures of the same type, three (3) single crown or three (3) trailers of the same type. Only LSAVC amateur members in good standing may enter Classes 4 and 5 and only LSAVC exhibitors who are AVSA commercial members in good standing may enter Classes 9 and 10. Name of the Texas hybridizer must appear beside the name of the cultivar on the entry form.
- 30. All specimens in Classes, 4, 5, 9 and 10 (LSAVC Collections) and Classes 49, 50, 51, 52, 69, 70, and 71 (Texas hybridized) must be Texas hybridized plants appearing in a published list or hybridizer's list. Write the name of the hybridizer beside the name of the cultivar on entry form.
- 31. Any entry in a collection class, receiving a blue ribbon, is eligible for other special awards.
- 32. Only one (1) collection may be entered by an exhibitor in each collection class. Commercial members may exhibit in all classes except the Amateur Collection Classes (Class 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5). Amateur members may exhibit in all classes except Commercial Collection Classes (Class 6, 7, 8 9 and 10).
- 33. The Pittman Collection (Class 11) is a collection of three (3) different semiminatures, any three (3) different miniatures or any three (3) different trailers, that were hybridized by Hortense Pittman and may be exhibited by either an amateur or commercial member in good standing of LSAVC, to be eligible for the Pittman Collection award.

#### **DESIGN DIVISION**

- 34. Members wishing to enter designs must make their reservations with the Design Chairman, Bill Foster. No telephone requests will be accepted. All reservations will be accepted by US mail or email (preferred) to 1bpfoster@sbcglobal.net beginning September 15, 2014. All reservations must be postmarked no later than October 20, 2014. Reservations are accepted on a first received basis. Please include your name, and both the title of the design and the class number. You will be notified which design classes you are entered in.
- 35. An Exhibitor may enter as many classes as desired but will be limited to one entry per class.
- 36. A 3" x 5" card must accompany each design entry, containing the name of the African Violet varieties and names of the other material used, if known. A second 3" x 5" card, used for the interpretation of the design by the exhibitor, is optional.
- 37. Materials, plants and blossoms need not have been grown by the exhibitor, but the entry must be the work of the exhibitor.
- 38. Use of the American Flag, state flags, flags from other nations, plants on the endangered list from any state or nation, artificial plant material, or live creatures shall not be used in any design division exhibit.
- 39. Exhibitors must construct designs before coming to the show area.
- 40. Accessories, backdrops and draping are optional except as noted.
- 41. The Underwater Flower arrangement will be staged at eye level on a raised shelf with light blue background. Container limited to 12" in any direction.
- 42. No part of any design may touch or extend beyond the confines of the niche or space.
- 43. Design exhibits will have a limited number of entries in each class.
- 44. Care should be taken in attaching background to niche. All attachments should be removable so as not to damage the niche.


